Original Games

1. Back Seat Bingo

11. Word Association

14. Word Charades

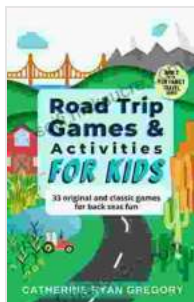

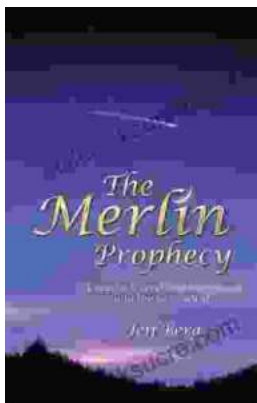

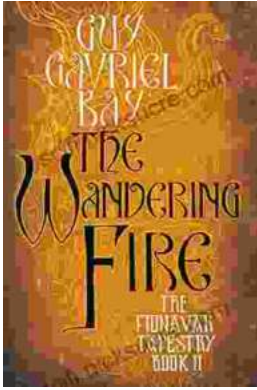
