

The two sides are separated by a river called the **eighth rank**. The squares on the board are alternately colored light and dark.

There are six different types of pieces in chess: pawns, rooks, knights, bishops, queens, and kings. Each type of piece has its own unique set of movements.

- Pawns move forward one square at a time, except for their first move, when they can move two squares forward. Pawns capture diagonally forward one square.
- Rooks move horizontally or vertically any number of squares.
- Knights move in an "L" pattern two squares in one direction and then one square perpendicularly. Knights can jump over other pieces.
- Bishops move diagonally any number of squares, staying on the same color.
- Queens are the most powerful pieces in chess. They can move horizontally, vertically, or diagonally any number of squares.
- Kings can move one square in any direction horizontally, vertically, or diagonally.

Once you understand the basic movements of the pieces, you can start to learn some basic tactics. Some of the most common tactics in chess include:

- **Fork:** A fork is a move that attacks two or more of your opponent's pieces at the same time.
- Pin: A pin is a move that prevents your opponent's piece from moving because it would expose their king to check.
- Check: A check is a move that puts your opponent's king under attack.
- Checkmate: A checkmate is a check that cannot be escaped.

The goal of chess is to checkmate your opponent's king. There are many different ways to checkmate, but some of the most common include:


- Smothered mate: A smothered mate occurs when the king is checkmated by a knight that is hidden behind one of its own pawns.

- Insufficient material: A draw by insufficient material occurs when neither player has enough pieces to checkmate the other player.

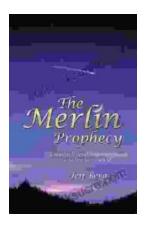
